 In the first six months, the RACQ Foundation approved funding of over \$4.5m to 90 community groups

 To date, the RACQ Foundation have approved funding of over \$7.6m to over 180 community groups for natural disaster recovery

Eligibility


Fund up to \$50,000 per applicant, but will fund up to \$200,000 in exceptional circumstances

- 1. Fund community organisations and charities
- 2. For the benefit of Queensland communities who have been affected by weather events or seek to prevent future events from negatively impacting on Queensland communities
- 3. The project must be completed within 12 months of funding




Foundation in Action

Murilla Community Centre


- Drought impacted Western Downs region


Sole benefactor
